CEO Report

Happy New Year to everyone across our incredible 4-H community. Along with many of the community members I have been able to talk to over the past few months, I am hoping this new year brings some positive changes so we can continue to focus on supporting and developing our amazing youth across Alberta. I thought this would be a great moment to highlight a few items our team will be focusing on for this year.



Over the years, 4-H has created some incredible tools and resources. These tools and resources are critical; however, many of them are created but then do not evolve to adjust to the changing needs of 4-H youth and their community. 4-H Alberta will be dusting off many of these processes and policies to ensure they are regularly reviewed and adjusted to best serve our youth while aligning with [4-H Alberta's strategic plan](#). Some examples include shipping club supplies, club registration, member registration, screening, payments, and deadlines. Over the past months I've watched these processes both as a 4-H parent and a 4-H administrator and am beginning to talk with club leaders to ask what would best serve them and their youth.

Traditions in 4-H need to be related to the key aspects of the strategic plan and 4-H fundamentals but processes and procedures must be community-first focused. Improving these processes involves investigating what is working and what is not. However, it also helps to know the current expectations of successful youth programs, to make sure we are meeting or exceeding those expectations in the years to come. This will be a key focus for our new Strategic Director of Growth. This new staff member will join our 4-H team in the new year! While addressing many of these processes may not appear exciting, improving these fundamentals will improve the overall experience in 4-H and reduce distractions that detract from focusing on serving our youth.

- on behalf of 4-H Alberta, be available to attend the upcoming leadership summit in Halifax, Nova Scotia, April 22-24, 2022!

Responsibilities

- Attend and participate actively in all in-person and teleconference meetings.
- Actively participate in assigned working groups including:
 - Assisting 4-H Canada staff in the planning and facilitation of national conferences;
 - Acting in an advisory capacity to 4-H Canada staff on various topics; and
 - Representing 4-H youth members at the national level to the 4-H Canada Board of Directors.
