Club Registration Dates for 2022

October 1 to November 15, 2022

The November 15 date is in place to facilitate the Leader Screening process. If a club is not able to meet that deadline this year, please reach out to your Area Coordinator for an extension up to December 1.

Now is the time to start your screening or rescreening!

Are you planning to return as a leader or putting your name forward for the first time this club year? All leaders and volunteers must be screened within 30 days for clubs to be approved.

New for clubs and leaders in 2022–2023

To be approved as a club:

- All leaders* in the Leader Tab must be trained and screened.
- All volunteers in the Volunteer Tab must be screened.

*Leaders = general leaders, club registrars, assistant leaders, project leaders, assistant project leaders, and clever leaders.

Prior to the start of their role, leaders must be trained and screened, and volunteers must be screened. If they are recruited, leaders and volunteers have 30 days to complete their screening and training.

The 30 days begin once the “Screening Required” email is sent from 4-H Alberta. If the screening and training items are not submitted to 4-H Alberta by the leader/volunteer within 30 days, the club’s membership will be contacted to vote in a new leader/volunteer.

Check your profile to see if you are due for rescreening.

- If you screened in 2019–20 (**or before**), you will need to rescreen for this club year (2022–23).

Training requirements for all leaders:

- Abuse Prevention and Duty to Report (includes [Commit to Kids](#))
- [Youth Safety](#)

Screening requirements for both leaders and volunteers:

- Police Check including Vulnerable Sector
- 3 references for new individuals; 1 reference for rescreening
- Application

Plotoo Payments

In 2022, while exclusively using Plotoo as a way for clubs to accept payments from 4-H Alberta, the Accounting Department processed approximately 1,000 payables to clubs, districts, regions, and vendors across Alberta with an acceptance rate of 90% of payments deposited with the instructions sent.



When you receive an email from Plotoo notifying you of the payment from 4-H Alberta, you will need to open the email to accept the funds. This can be done by logging in to your online bank account or clicking on the link at the very bottom of the payment page that says:

 [Manually enter void cheque/EFT information instead](#)

Click here to enter the bank information from a void check, including the five-digit transit number and three-digit bank number.

Important ATB note: If you have a bank account with ATB, two zeros are required before the bank account number for 11 digits total. For example, account #123456789 must be entered as #00123456789.

A password is required to accept the funds. This password is 685 + your four-digit PCode. A PCode is unique to your club, district, or region. "685" is part of the Plotoo password. **Example: 685****.**

Follow these simple steps to find your four-digit PCode:

1. Sign into your ORS account.
2. Click on "Club Admin."
3. Click on the grey edit button (looks like a pencil) beside your club name.
4. Click on the tab named "Sponsorship."
5. The four numbers beside "PC Code" is what you are looking for located in the "Administrative Use Only" area.

To receive your region or district's four-digit number, please contact your Area Coordinator. Depending on your preferred method, they will either text you your four-digit number or give it to you over the phone.

Due to the ORS setup for the district or region, locating the Club Code on the ORS system is currently unavailable.

Clubs are responsible for information accuracy and future changes.
