One event will not start until the prior activity is complete, unless otherwise indicated. Please be prepared for this!

Competitions:

Marketing/Sales Talk: Completed at home before coming to Synergy.

- Sheep show participants will be expected to do the Synergy marketing project to be included in the aggregate points for the 4-H Alberta Sheep show.
- If you are not participating in the Summer Synergy Program it will still be the same project and submitted at the deadline. Please refer to the summer synergy website for details.

Team Herdsman: Monday - 6:00 p.m.

- There will be a portion of this competition to do at home - please watch for details.

Cow Palace

- Juniors, Intermediate and Senior members will be put into teams with other contestants of the 4-H Alberta Livestock show and Summer Synergy.

The teams will be participating in various tasks related to the Livestock industry

Multi Judging Contest: Tuesday - 8:30 a.m.

Calouri Pavilion

This is a required 4-H competition! All members are *automatically entered* in the appropriate age category. Members compete as individuals and stay with their assigned groups. Competition will be in conjunction with the Multi Judging portion of Summer Synergy.

- This is a multi-species judging competition. All members will judge all classes.
- Judging the classes will be done on an **individual basis**. Anyone that is suspected of copying or conferring with others, including showmen, will be excused from the contest. **NO TALKING is allowed**. Anyone caught talking, regardless of the topic, will be excused.
- Numbers will identify all animals in the various judging classes. (A class is always numbered left to right from the rear.)
- Judging cards will be provided. **Each contestant should bring their own pencil or pen and a clipboard** for use as a writing surface in the ring.
- The competition may consist of beef, sheep, forage and other species. EPD's may be included in class information. **50** points are given for placing and **50** points for oral reasons on each class.
- An official judge will be appointed to judge the classes and the official placing will be made available.
- Participants will be allocated an amount of time to judge each class. Members must stay with their assigned group for the entire competition. All classes will be judged and at the conclusion of judging classes, reasons will be presented.
- Each contestant shall appear singly before the judge to give oral reasons.
- Points will be deducted for the use of notes when giving oral reasons. (15 for junior and intermediate, 20 for senior)

If a tie occurs in a class, the individual scoring the highest number of points on reasons, in that class, will be declared the winner and, if the tie is still unbroken, the award will be given to the individual scoring the highest number of points overall.

Everyone, other than contestants, attendants, judges and the contest supervisor shall be excluded from the ring when the judging is in progress.

A designated number shall identify each contestant and judges will only question contestants on anything other than the classes being judged.

Sheep Trimming: Tuesday - 2:00 p.m.

Infield

- A lamb which has never been washed or trimmed will be provided for participants. Lambs are to be distributed at random and all competitors will be given 45 minutes to trim.
- Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors to compete separately.
- **No Products will be allowed in this class.** It is a dry class, meaning no water either.
- Be prepared for Feedlot Lambs
- Please bring appropriate equipment

Costume Class: *Tuesday night*

Infield

Although the costume class is not part of the grand aggregate calculations, the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show Committee encourages all sheep project members to participate in the costume class which will take place on Saturday morning. There are no specific criteria for this event; almost anything goes so long as it is in the spirit of 4-H values. Members and their animal(s) are part of the costume class. Get creative and bring your "A" game and you are guaranteed to have a great time!

Showmanship Classes: *Wednesday – 9:00 a.m.*

Infield

Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors will compete separately. The top two in each age category will advance to compete for overall Grand and Reserve Champion Showmanship.

- Members will compete using their own breeding project. The member will use the same animal throughout the showmanship heats leading into the showmanship final
- A member entering the show without a breeding project may be supplied with a lamb by the committee.
- 4-H members will be judged throughout the conformation classes

Show Team Judging: *Wednesday – 9:00 a.m.*

Infield

- Open to all members in the 4-HAB S.S.
- For the show team sheep judging component of the show, members will consist of teams of two members, the team will be judged on their ability to work the show ring and judge a Class.
- Members will choose their partners from their age category at the show .
- Members are encouraged to wear appropriate "Show/Judge" attire. Members are encouraged to provide and show an animal for the competition.

4-H Sheep Learning: *Wednesday– 2:00 p.m*

Infield

- Learn about topics that relate to our sheep industry. Past learning modules included - dystocia, feet trimming, feed rations, market lamb selection.

Summer Synergy Sheep Flock Show & Showcase: *Wednesday– 5:00 p.m*

Infield

- Flock Show & Showcase - a massed gathering of all the flocks in one ring where grand and reserve are selected. Beef and Sheep members alike help the flock owner show their flocks. It is an awe inspiring event to witness and an event that participants will remember for their lifetime.

Sheep Confirmation Classes: *Thursday– 8:30 a.m*

Infield

Classes are determined by the age of ewe. There will be two Yearling classes and two Mature classes - open and lambs at foot separately. The top two from each class will advance to overall Grand and Reserve Yearling and Grand and Reserve Mature. Junior, Intermediates and Seniors will show together.

- 1 ewe lamb* (which can be shown for three consecutive years). Ewe lambs must comply with the 4-H Alberta Sheep Standards.
- 1 yearling ewe* – open or with lambs at foot (must have been shown as a ewe lamb the previous year, at the club level).
- 1 mature ewe* – open or with lambs at foot (must be shown as a yearling ewe the previous year, at the club level). Must be only a 2 year old ewe, as stated in 4-H Alberta Sheep Standards.
- Remember that Showmanship is judged during this time as well as during the showmanship class.

*Only the above 4-H Breeding Classes are eligible to be used as conformation points in SUMMER SYNERGY

Master Showmanship Class: *Friday – 12:00 p.m.*

Megadome

Grand Drive & Supreme Showcase: *Friday ~1:30 p.m.*

The top animals in each breeding stock class (ewe lamb, yearling ewe, mature ewe and flock) are invited to the Champion Drive & Supreme where a Supreme Champion will be announced.

4-H Alberta Provincial Sheep Show

Rules and Regulations

The Show Committee strongly encourages all participants to **review** these rules.

The following rules are approved and enforced by the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show (4-HAB S.S.) Committee.

1. No late registrations will be allowed.
2. **4-H record books are not mandatory to bring to the show.**
3. All sheep entered in the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show **MUST** be at the barn by **5 pm** Monday afternoon. Registration will take place at 6 pm in the **Cow Palace**, Monday and Group Photo with program shirts will be at 1:45 p.m., Tuesday, July 9th.
4. Penning assignments will be posted Sunday. Members must use their assigned pens.
5. All tails must be docked to an appropriate length to fully cover the vulva in ewes and the equivalent length in rams. In accordance with the National Farm Animal Care Council Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Sheep - Husbandry Practices 5.7. The exception for tail docking is for the hair sheep breeds (Katahdin, Dorper, etc.) and short tailed breeds (East Friesian, Finn, Icelandic, Karakul, Romanov, Shetland)
6. All animals **must** be tagged with CSIP/RFID tags, and provide any changes to 4-H Alberta as soon as possible.
7. All breeding stock animals must be current registered 4-H project animals, in their respective province.
8. Lambs at foot may come in as intact rams. Intact rams are encouraged to enter the Ram Lamb-O-Rama.
9. **4-H Alberta S.S Hi-Point Award** will consist of accumulated points from all classes and participation in all elements of the show including the educational component.
10. There are **five** required classes to be entered at the **4-HAB S.S.** in order to be eligible for **Summer Synergy Aggregate** awards. They include Breeding Stock, Showmanship, Trimming, Multi-Judging, and Marketing Class.
11. Show products may be used on project animals for the conformation and showmanship classes.
12. All breeding stock **MUST** show in fleece that is less than 1" in length. All ewes must be sheared within the calendar year.
13. All animals must be trimmed and ready to be checked by the assigned committee members by Monday at **5:00 pm**. Please ensure livestock is ready for inspection upon arrival or pre-arranged check in time. If the fleece requirements are not met by Tuesday at 6:00 pm the animal will not be allowed to be shown.
14. The 4-H Alberta Sheep Show committee reserves the right to remove injured, sick or unfit lambs from the barns after consultation with the member and family involved.

The following classes are available:

1. **BREEDING STOCK CLASSES (Open to all Registered 4-H Projects)**

- o 1 ewe lamb* (which can be shown for three consecutive years). Ewe lambs must comply with the 4-H Alberta Sheep Standards.
- o 1 yearling ewe* – open or with lambs at foot (must have been shown as a ewe lamb the previous year, at the club level).
- o 1 mature ewe* – open or with lambs at foot (must be shown as a yearling ewe the previous year, at the club level). Must be only a 2 year old ewe, as stated in 4-H Alberta Sheep Standards.

*Only the above 4-H Breeding Classes are eligible to be used as conformation points in AGGREGATE.

CLASS SIZES and SPLITS

- **Breeding Ewes:** Junior, Intermediates and Seniors will show together. Classes are determined by the age of lamb at foot. The top two from each class will advance to overall Grand and Reserve Yearling and Grand and Reserve Mature.
- **Showmanship:** Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors will compete separately. The top two in each age category will advance to compete for overall Grand and Reserve Champion Showmanship.
- **Judging:** Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors will be marked separately on sheep classes only.

OTHER GENERAL RULES:

General 4-H Program Rules:

Members must not:

- Arrive at the program, or during the program be, under the influence or in possession of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs.
- Use any tobacco product (cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, and so on.)
- Disrupt the effectiveness of the program.

All members have agreed to these terms at the time of registration. If a participant fails to comply with these rules, he/she will lose the privileges of this program; his/her parent or guardian will be contacted, and he/she will return home at his/her own expense. The member's program registration fee will be retained. The member may/may not be eligible to attend future Summer Synergy Week programs.

The 4-H Alberta Sheep Show is **not** a residential 4-H program. Supervision of members is a responsibility of the designated adult in charge.

All 4-H Alberta Sheep Show Competitors must have a designated "adult in charge" who will be on site for the entire length of the time that member is on site. This person was identified and contact information was provided during registration. If this changes, please notify tracy.dietrich@4hab.com ASAP.

4-HAB S.S. Committee

- Decisions regarding these rules or special situations arising at the show will be at the discretion of the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show Committee. The Committee's decision will be final.

Participation

- **ALL** members are expected to be actively involved in preparing their own animals with no active parental involvement
- If special circumstances arise where a 4-H member is not able to show their sheep, the member is responsible to make arrangements with the 4-H Sheep Show Committee prior to the show.
- All members who enter the show are **automatically entered** into the appropriate age category in the **4-H Marketing** and **4-H Sheep Judging** classes of the show. All members will be entered in the Show Team Judging Contest. All 4-H members can participate in any contest without livestock - with the exception of the Conformation classes which require you to bring your own breeding stock.
- All project animals will be checked to ensure they meet all entry requirements, including wool length. Please ensure Livestock is ready for wool inspection upon arrival or your specified check in time. Check in times can be arranged via google document available after registration closes

Supervision

4-H leaders and adults associated with the clubs are responsible for adequate supervision of their members. 4-H staff or program volunteers will **not** act as chaperones. Parents must not confuse supervision of their children and members with coaching.

Age Categories

- Members and teams will participate in these age categories: **Junior:** 9-11; **Intermediate:** 12-14; and **Senior:** 15-20 as of December 31st, 2023.

Parent Participation

- Parent participation in the care and preparation of animals is not allowed except in cases of exhibitor or public safety. If assistance is required, the show committee will assist. Inappropriate behaviour, as determined by the Provincial Sheep Show Committee, Summer Synergy committee and ORE Event Management, by participants or their families, may result in forfeiting of all prizes and opportunities.
- All participants and their families abide by a respectful and considerate contestant environment. Inappropriate behaviour, as determined by the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show Committee, Synergy volunteer committee, ORE Event Management and 4-H Alberta Staff, by participants and their families may result in forfeiting of all prizes and opportunities.
- Parents, Leaders, Coaches doing their members' work will receive one warning. A second warning will result in disqualification of the member from the show.

Note: 4-H members may assist fellow 4-Hers, or may bring along extra members to help! Some key members may be identified who will be able assist first-time exhibitors when asked. Anyone is invited to ask members of the committee or other competitors for help. Parents are needed and encouraged to assist as volunteers throughout the show.

Stalls & Neatness

- Endeavour to keep your stall area neat and tidy and your livestock looked after.
- Biosecurity rules will be in place, any communicable disease will not be allowed in barns. No active sore mouth, pink eye, foot rot, etc. will be allowed in the barns at 4-HAB S.S. Ewe lambs and Yearlings unable to show due to a biosecurity risk will be eligible to show the following year (Leaders to confirm and notify). This rule also applies to trimming lambs.
- Any animals showing communicable disease will be refused entry to the show (at the discretion of the 4-H AB S.S. Committee)

Tack & Feed Area

- There will be an assigned tack and feed area to each 4-H member/club and these are to be shared by those assigned to the area.

Stalling & Arrival

- Clubs that arrive early may not be able to unload until after 12:00 pm, on Sunday without prior approval of the show committee. All animals MUST be in the barns no later than 5:00 pm on Monday afternoon.
- **All animals must be washed before arrival at the Sheep Show.**
- All animals should be in the Tents, north of the Cow Palace, in the infield by **5:00 pm**. Stalling is provided for all 4-H entries from 12:00 p.m. on Sunday to show completion. All animals will be housed in the Tents. Anyone who attempts to change their assigned stalling spot before permission is granted risks being asked to return home.
- Initial shavings for bedding are provided, straw is not allowed. Additional shavings can be purchased. Clubs are asked to store feed in their trailers.
- Stall cards should be hung. You may use a 4-H stall card or one of your own design; no farm advertising please. All members must stall in assigned areas.

Release Time

- Release time is following the show on Saturday. Stalls should be cleaned before leaving and please clean all garbage in the area around your stall. Special permission may be obtained from the show office if you are leaving to attend another show or 4-H event. Anyone who leaves before release time will be **excused** from the event next year.

Camping

- Camping is available on site, in the infield, north of the Cow Palace. Portable toilets are provided, and showers are available in the Calouri Pavilion. Your camper is considered your home. While outside the camper, you are considered to be on the program site and 4-H program rules apply!
- Camping is also available across 54th Street from the Cow Palace in O. R. Hedges Park. This campground has hook-ups; please contact the campground for further details and unit costs. There is also a shower house in the Park, but only those camping in O. R. Hedges Park is eligible to use this shower house. Those abusing the rule will be asked to leave the park.

Quiet Time-

- The Show Committee and the Town of Olds has declared that 11:00 pm - 7:00 am, each day, is "Quiet Time". As of 9:00 pm there is no power rule each night of the program this means no blowers or music in the Tent area and MegaDome Stalling past these times, but there will be NO NOISE around the grounds after these posted hours. NO NOISE means no loud voices, no stereos, no stunt driving, etc.

Programming Area

- Due to concerns from both sponsors and exhibitors, all areas within ORE grounds & the Town of Olds are considered “Programming Area”. As such, this entire area is subject to the Program Agreement Form each member and parent signs. Further, **no bicycles, skate boards, et al, are allowed in the buildings or Infield.** In addition, if your project animal has to leave the programming area for any reason, please inform Arlene Good or Tracy Gardner at the Show Offices before any such removal.

Liability

- Olds Regional Exhibition and the 4-H Alberta Program will not be held liable for any injury or damage to animals or equipment while en route to, from, or at, this event.

“Partying” Policy

- The entire grounds... Those owned by the Olds Regional Exhibition as well as those owned by the Town of Olds... are considered the programming area. And the “*programming time*” is defined as “*24-hours/day from the time of your arrival on site to the time of your departure*”. Any 4-H member, parent or leader found to be violating the 4-H Program Agreement Form signed upon registration will be asked to leave the program immediately. **There will be no exceptions.**

Dress

- Members having club uniforms are encouraged to wear their uniform for the conformation classes. Exhibitors will receive a program t-shirt celebrating the event and its sponsors, and members are encouraged to wear this t-shirt for the large group photo and the trimming classes.
- For Judging and Show Team it is suggested that the participants dress in a professional manner. Members will wear appropriate show ring attire (no half shirts, halter or tank tops) that is neat and clean, and proper footwear (boots or properly laced shoes). The Committee’s expectation is that staff, judges and volunteers will adhere to this same dress code and standard.

Equipment

- Entrants may find the following list of suggested equipment useful since all are necessary: water pail, feed tub, grooming equipment, show halter, tack box, 100’ extension cords and a hose. Please note the bringing of fans is strongly recommended.
- Club/individual signs and/or banners are optional. Individuals or clubs should bring their own trimming stands if they anticipate their use. Stall cards or banners may not contain any breed or farm advertising. Label all equipment.
- No feed is offered for sale. Water will be packed from the outlets and hoses are not to be strung from the faucets to the stalls. Clubs will store all feed and bedding in their trailers. We encourage you to bring your own extension cords.

Ram Lamb-O-Rama - Synergy Event

- Jackpot Ram Lamb class for the ram lambs at foot. Entry fee of \$5.00, will not be eligible for aggregate standings. Entry fee collected with show registration in the Summer Synergy Entries.

Protest Letter

- If individuals feel that rules have been broken and wish to protest, they must deliver a letter to the 4-H show office, along with a **\$100** cheque to the 4-H Alberta, refundable, if the protest is upheld.

Tiebreakers are as follows in descending order: participation in all categories, total “Hi Point” points in skill classes, and placement in judging. Total number of points that can be accumulated for Intermediates and Seniors is 85 points and Juniors total number is 75 points.

It is the hope of the 4-H Alberta Sheep Show Committee that members will participate in as many events as possible. To encourage this, the Hi Point Awards are presented based on participation in the entire program. Jr., Int. and Sr. Hi Point winners will be recognized. There are five required classes to be entered at the 4-H AB.S.S. in order to be eligible for Hi Point awards. They are Conformation, Showmanship, Trimming, Judging, Show Team judging and the 4-H Marketing Class.

***If a member has more than one animal entered in breeding stock conformation classes, the animal with the best placing will be used when calculating aggregate points.**
