Over the last year as a Board, we have done a few things to prepare for the 2024-2025 Club year:

The members rotated around these sessions and really enjoyed the learning.


4-H Intro Clubs Returning to Calgary

- Once 4-H Alberta has received all the information, we will connect with the new member's club and confirm registration
- Once confirmed, your information will be shared with your designated Co-op for approval, then the club will receive the approved registration fees (please note you will be responsible for paying any amounts not covered by the CO-OP Growing Leader program.)

- You must be a new or second year CO-OP Growing Leader member to 4-H Alberta (NEW/ Returning CO-OP Growing Leader Members are welcome to apply)

NEW DEFAULT CONSTITUTION FOR CLUBS AND DISTRICTS

It's time to prepare for the 2024-25 club year. If you are not already using the default constitution provided, it must be adopted for the next club year (2024-**25), as per the Reference Guide**. What this means is that you need to include the information from the default constitution (you don't have to include the sections that show "Optional") but then you may add to it so that it fits your club or district. Remember that a constitution is a set of rules for running your club or district. It helps provide guidelines for conflict resolution. It also is the framework for action so that your club can accomplish its goals.

REMINDER ABOUT GOOD STANDING REQUIREMENTS FOR 2024-25

The dates for submitting documents for the 2024-25 year are changing. Why are they changing? We have heard the community. In order for a club to plan their year, they need to know when the district and region are planning their events. Members want an opportunity to participate at all levels..

Region Due Date: September 1/2024 District Due Date: November 1/2024 Club Due Date: January 15/2025

LEADER/VOLUNTEER SCREENING FOR THE 2024/2025 CLUB YEAR

- ▶ If your last screening date was 2021/22, you are due to rescreen in the 2024/25 club year.
- ▶ To be a LEADER in 4-H, you need current screening (updated every 3 years) PLUS completion of Youth Safety Training (or Youth Safety Refresher if it has been 3 years since your first training) and Commit to Kids training.
- ▶ To be a VOLUNTEER in 4-H, you need current screening (updated every 3 years)
- If you have a new leader or volunteer joining your club, please contact your Area Coordinator so that they can start the screening process before the club year starts.


